Method Adopted to Create Learning Package

This training module is the result of a series of technical meetings and considerable team efforts. Almost 120 eminent experts, teachers, neonatologists and nurses have contributed to the making of this module. Intense inputs from AIIMS team of nurses, residents and faculty to translate the agreed contents into an easy readable resource material using participatory teaching learning methodology. The resultant module which has latest evidence based practices related to newborn care has drawn heavily from the attributes of the IMCI modules and latest materials of ENCC package and PCPNC guidelines of WHO-HQ's. Following pilot testing the modules have undergone field testing at Jaipur, Indore, Dhaka and multiple course in the state of Gujarat. Incorporation of feedback from the facilitators and monitors have resulted in creation of this training tool. The evidence-based principles of newborn care were carefully adapted for application in the operational milieu of small health facilities.
